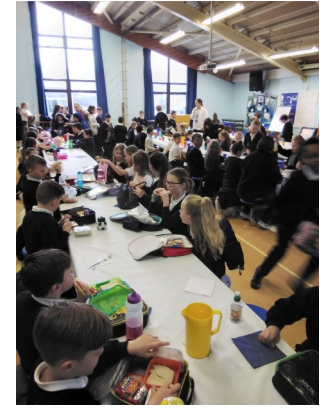
Founders Day

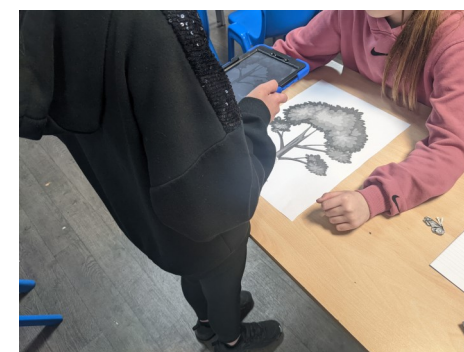
We all had an exciting day and it was lovely being together and sharing our special day.

The week of the 14th March marked British Science Week and all the children at Kingfisher joined in with experiments and smashing stereotypes. We also had a science assembly the week before by Pop, Whizz, Bang to introduce our science week.

Science week was an excellent opportunity for our students to explore their curiosity about the world. The theme of growth offered a wide variety of activities for our students to complete, from the small (plant growth) to the bigger picture (can we live on the moon?). Each activity offered a great insight into the scientific world, with students utilising a lot of skills in their scientific toolkit, adapting their mindset to each task. Year 6 particularly loved the opportunity to listen to guest speakers from the Open University; these scientists gave them a real insight into space, particularly looking at the moon and its ability to hold life, and how we ourselves can train to be astronauts. The week itself was incredibly informative and has no doubt planted some seeds of interest in the students which will grow for years to come.
