The children have all explored our indoor and outdoor environments, showing curiosity, a willingness to try new things and to practise and improve skills. All our Cygnet children have been developing the skills they need to be good class mates and, in some instances, good friends. They are developing a respect and responsibility for each other and their school environment.

Developing skills

During the two terms we have spent together we have practised and developed skills such as exploring art materials, name writing, counting, cutting out, making models and role playing. We have visited the forest and the children are all really at home and know how to be safe in this environment. It was so lovely to welcome parents into the class at the end of Term 1 and the beginning of Term 2 to join in our Diwali celebration and the annual Pumpkin Carve. We have really missed these times to share your child's school life with you and hope to do much more of this over the rest of the academic year.







APPLES AND CELEBRATIONS

Swans have had a wonderfully busy term! We have settled in well and have enjoyed exploring different areas of the environment. The children enjoyed a special visit from the 'Apple Ladies' where we learnt all about different types of apples and where they come from. The 'Pink lady' apple was very popular indeed! We have also been lucky enough to invite parents in for Diwali celebrations and Pumpkin carving where lots of fun was had, along with a class trip to Morrisons.

ACTIVITIES

In the lead up to Christmas we have learnt all about pumpkins, hedgehogs and have enjoyed exploring the forest where we've made hedgehog homes, firework leaf sparklers and looked for signs of autumn and winter. The children thoroughly enjoyed the pantomime and also really enjoyed our school Christmas dinner.







LONDON

This term Robins have been learning about London and it's iconic landmarks such as Buckingham Palace and Tower Bridge. We have learnt that Buckingham Palace has 775 rooms and that the gold cross on top of St Paul's Cathedral is the weight of 7 cars!!

Jeremy from the Guildhall Museum came into school to tell us all about the Great Fire of London and why the fire spread so quickly. They didn't have the fire brigade then so people were using buckets of water to put the fire out. We also learnt about fire safety and how to keep ourselves safe.

MATHS

Robin's have been practising their number bonds up to 20 this term so they are able to recall them really quickly. We have also looked at 2D and 3D shapes and found different shapes around school.





DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

This term Year 2 have been learning different joins, sliders and levers. The children especially enjoyed learning the flange join. We will use what we have learned to make castles and some very special cards.

THE PAPERBAG PRINCESS



NATIVITY

Year 2 have been practising hard for the nativity this term and the children have learnt all their lines and songs brilliantly. We look forward to being able to share it with parents in the new year as it is really important that the children get to perform their nativity. Thank you for your support with costumes. CORE LEARNING

In maths we have been learning about place value and the order of numbers. We have really been focusing on our times tables and making sure we have quick recall with our 2, 5, 10, 3 and 4 timetables. In English we have read a story about Snow-White and the Angry Dwarf, he was very angry! The children wrote character descriptions about him. We have also been reading The Firework Makers' Daughter and the white elephant called Hamlet, has been being used as a billboard!

FOUNDATION SUBJECTS

In RE we looked at the stories of Moses. We found out about the 10 commandments and we even made our own for the classroom. We have also been looking at different Christmas traditions including our own.

In PE we have learnt lots of foot and hand skills, developed our hand eye co-ordination and how to work as a team.

We have also learnt some really effective art skills. We made wild animals come to life with our amazing shading skills.









TERM 1

Year 4 have been working extremely hard during terms 1 and 2 and have made me and themselves enormously proud of their progress. In term 1, children were reading the book Cosmic which is all about a boy who gets lost in space! The children loved this book and published some amazing writing in their publishing books, we were most proud of their brochure about a theme park called Infinity Park. In Curriculum our big question was 'Where did I come from?' and the children spent some time in geography looking at their local area and learnt some gooey facts about the digestive system in science!

TERM 2


In term 2, year 4 have been reading a book called Varjak Paw which they have all extremely enjoyed-they became Varjak's biggest supporter to help him save his family! They can't wait to read the second book as our class reading book next term. During Curriculum, year 4 have been learning about Romans and have immensely grown their knowledge about the invasions of Romans. For DT, we made catapults and learnt how catapults were used by Romans. In Science, we have been learning about states of matter and we were able to explore the different states of matter. During terms 1 and 2, every Wednesday the children learnt how to play the Ukulele and were able to play Jingle Bells by the end of the term! They were extremely proud of themselves. We are very excited for next term to make even more progress!












In term 1 year 5 we looked at the question of "where did I come from?". We covered this question in a variety of subjects; Identifying countries, looking at the difference between the United Kingdom and the British Isles and the counties that make up England. We also delved into our literary history looking at classics such as Charles Dickens and Shakespeare, discussing themes of morality and good & evil. To solidify this knowledge and understanding year 5 went on a trip to Shakespeare's globe, getting a tour form one of the actors. They also took part in a workshop run by the actors, specifically focusing on the witches' scene in Macbeth.





TERM 2

In term 2 Year 5 focused on 20th century conflict. We spent the term delving into both World Wars, looking specifically at World War One and how the consequences affected Europe leading up to World War Two. Students looked at the timeline of events, the weaponry used, the political climates, life for soldiers in the trenches and the treaty of Versailles. We covered world war two in both history and English, reading 'letters form the lighthouse' to understand the experience of evacuated children and the struggles of the refugees from Europe escaping Hitler. This knowledge was consolidated when students paid a visit to fort Amherst, where they saw the reconstructions of the fort during war time, and delved through its tunnels. They also reached the highest point in Chatham and looked at various local landmarks.







EVENTS AND TRIPS

This term in Year 6 has been full of great events, trips and hard work! The class went to Fort Amherst where they were taken through the tunnels which helped Medway throughout the war. This was linked to our book that we have studied throughout the term called 'Letters From the Lighthouse'. We also went to the cinema to see the Railway Children Return which was a great experience for us all. The girls came third in the Southern Schools football tournament and the boys ended up winning.

SUPER LEARNING

This term has also seen children building Anderson shelters, experimenting with light and sharpening their basketball and dance skills. The remarkable children of Year 6 have also refined their fractions, decimals and percentages skills and are showing great progress in their reading. I hope everyone in year 6 (teachers included) has a fantastic Christmas and a happy New Year! We look forward to having you back in January when the SATs push will continue!





GABRIELLI ROAR

Year 5 and 6 were invited to participate in a concert with the singers of Gabrelli Roar. The children had a rehearsal with the artistic director at school before heading to Canterbury Cathedral for their second rehearsal and final performance. Kingfisher were part of an ensemble of 400 children and performed alongside children from Saxon Way and Lordswood. This opportunity was created from the links that Mr Delevitt, The Griffin Schools Trust music director, had created with Gabrielli.
